

JOLLABORATION ISTHE MOTHER OF INVENTION at Pavlychenko Studios, Canada's longestrunning modern dance studio. When Nadia Pavlychenko founded the Toronto-based school in 1962, she believed the survival of contemporary dance depended on its ability to integrate with other disciplines such as the visual arts, theatre and music. Six years after Pavlychenko's death, her sister Larissa continues to invite artists from a variety of disciplines to help create new and experimental dance works.

The last of the Studio's regular weekend performances (July 19 and 20) features students—many of them professional dancers—from the summer school. About a dozen students will perform works they created during master classes and repertory sessions under the direction of Milton Myers, artistic director of New York's Joyce Trisler Danscompany and a former principal dancer with the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theatre.
