# A PROCLAMATION

For Uniting the Provinces of Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick, into one Dominion, under the name of CANADA.

VICTORIA R.

**WHEREAS** by an Act of Parliament, passed on the Twenty-ninth day of March, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-seven, in the Thirtieth year of Our reign, intituled, "An Act for the Union of Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick, and the Government thereof, and for purposes connected therewith," after divers recitals it is enacted that "it shall be lawful for the Queen, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, to declare, by Proclamation, that on and after a day therein appointed, not being more than six months after the passing of this Act, the Provinces of Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick, shall form and be One Dominion under the name of Canada, and on and after that day those Three Provinces shall form and be One Dominion under that Name accordingly;" and it is thereby further enacted, that Such Persons shall be first summoned to the Senate as the Queen by Warrant, under Her Majesty's Royal Sign Manual, thinks fit to approve, and their Names shall be inserted in the Queen's Proclamation of Union:"

We, therefore, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, have thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do ordain, declare, and command that on and after the First day of July, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-seven, the Provinces of Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick, shall form and be One Dominion, under the name of CANADA.

And we do further ordain and declare that the persons whose names are herein inserted and set forth are the persons of whom we have by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual thought fit to approve as the persons who shall be first summoned to the Senate of Canada.

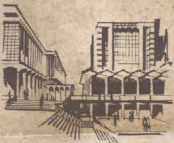

# A PROCLAMATION

For Uniting the Provinces of Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick, into one Dominion, under the name of CANADA.

VICTORIA R.

**WHEREAS** by an Act passed on the Twenty-ninth day of August, in the Eighth year of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act for the Union of the Provinces of New Brunswick, and the Government thereof, with the Government connected therewith," after divers Provisions therein made, it shall be lawful for the Queen, by and with the Advice and Consent of Her Most Honorable Privy Council, to do, on and after a day therein appointed, all such things as should be done, in and towards Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick, and the Colonies and Territories thereunto annexed, in connection with the Union under the name of Canada, and the Government thereof, and that Three Provinces shall form and be called the Dominion of Canada, and that the Name accordingly;" and it is enacted, that such Persons shall be first summoned to the said Parliament, as by Warrant, under Her Majesty's Sign Manual, under the Great Seal, to approve, and their Names shall be inserted in the said Proclamation of Union:"

**We, therefore, by and with the Advice and Consent of Our Privy Council, have thought fit to issue the following Proclamation:** We do ordain, declare, and command that the Provinces of New Brunswick, and Nova Scotia, and the Colonies and Territories thereunto annexed, shall form and be called the Dominion of Canada, and that the Name accordingly;" and it is enacted, that such Persons shall be first summoned to the said Parliament, as by Warrant, under Her Majesty's Sign Manual, under the Great Seal, to approve, and their Names shall be inserted in the said Proclamation of Union:"

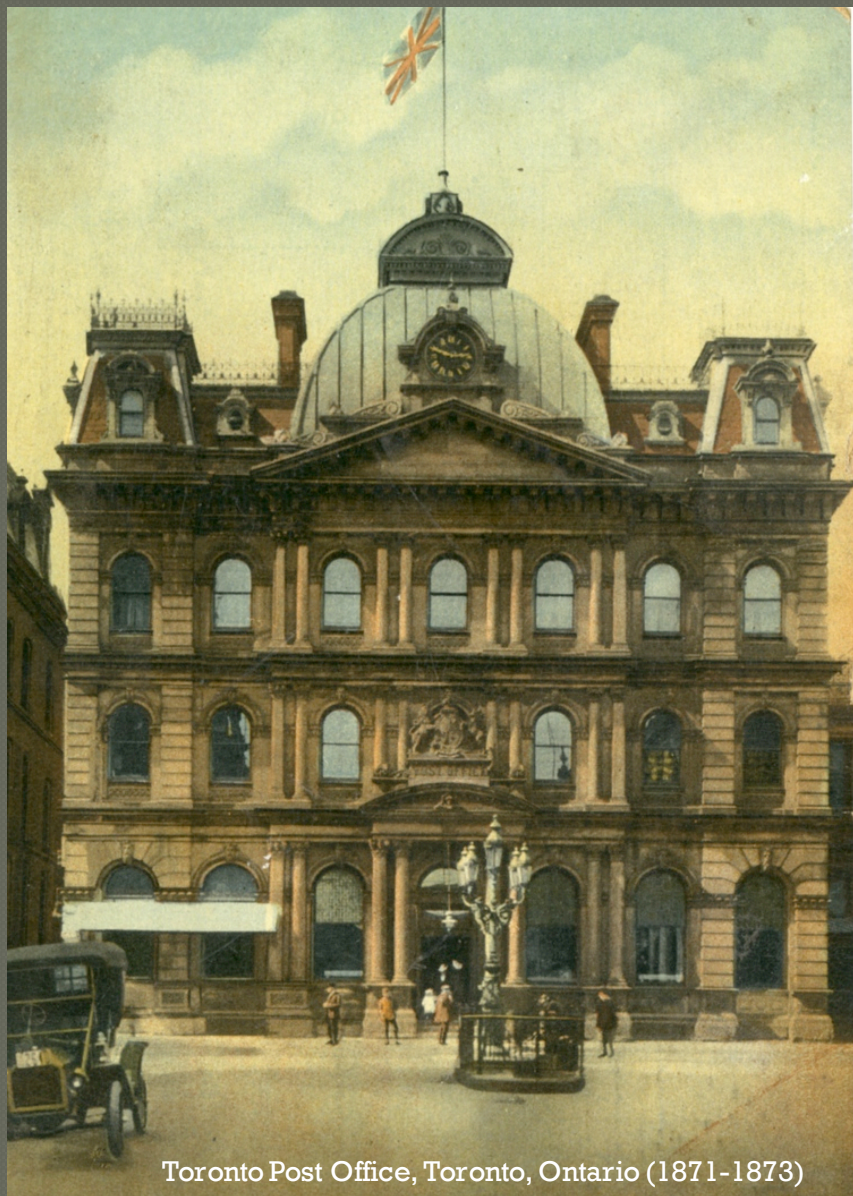

THE UNITED-STATES POST OFFICE, BROADWAY, PARK ROW AND MAIL STREET.

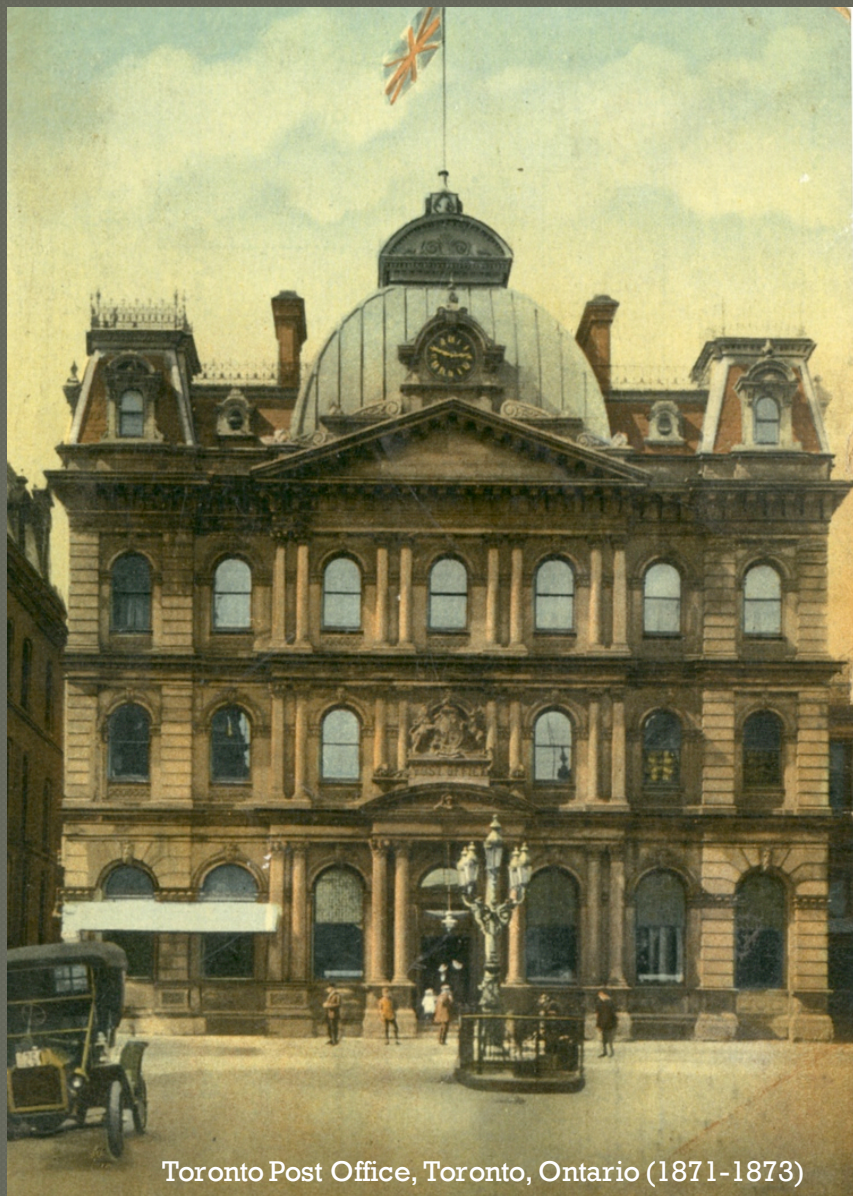

## Confederation

When the clock struck midnight on the 30<sup>th</sup> of June, 1867, the joy bells of St. James' Cathedral rang out; it was the 1<sup>st</sup> of July, the birthday of the new Dominion. Confederation was accomplished and Toronto was once more a capital. The capital only of a Province, it is true, but that Province the wealthiest, the most enterprising, and the most populous in the Union. The day was observed by the greatest rejoicings in the city. What with bonfires, fireworks and illuminations, excursions, military displays and musical and other entertainments, the citizens and the thousands of strangers who crowded the streets did not want for amusement. Since the visit of the Prince of Wales no such day had been witnessed in Toronto.
